- 1. Welcome to Becky taking on Heath Upper as Co-ordinator, Kate Stewart checking out whether she could fit the co-ordinator role into her busy life and welcome back to Rose shadowing Mark to see if the newsletter editor post is for her!
- 2. Apologies: Ron Coleman, Lesley Ashley, Tim Davies, Mike Baker (GONE being discussed by D&BH tonight), Peter Tucker, Martyn Thomas.
- 3. Matters of accuracy and arising: Omissions from the last minutes, Barry Shore & Malcolm Coles.

Item 10 on last minutes for benefit of new arrivals and Rose, should disaster strike a resident a letter will be sent out to them, this was explained by Bill.

Bill on hoax agenda item Snopes (website that de-bunks nonsense). Bill talked about the surprise presentation at the last meeting to himself and Ron Coleman and also entertained us with some anecdotes about the presentation ceremony they attended with their wives at the invite of the Chair of S. Glos council. The certificate received and paper weight, together with a Post newspaper article was passed round and thanks given again by Bill.

- 4. None of the PCSOs could attend. Rocky sent message re the spike in crime figures
 - Non dwelling (garages and sheds) break in has been reduced
 - Team reassured committee that recent spike in crime has been met by intense work from Beat Team working long hours in plain clothes and uniform and using all forms of getting about and support.

Bill printed spike details from the Police UK website – hotspots seem to be Glenside (where Maria lives!) and Windsor Court, although residents have been in touch in the past expressing concern and Bill had asked about it, nothing had come back from Police – could be domestic violence, in which case Chris Stone would let local people know quietly what is going on.

5. Data Protection – Ringmaster- up date – turn the screw on thieves. Discussion about number plate theft or possibly just copying – Graeme brought in estate agents advertising

card clearly showing a house for sale with a car on the drive, the number plate of which was quite clear. The adverts are on national websites and can be copied, by thieves. Police in partnership are suggesting – turn the screw on thieves – using security screws on number plates instead of standard fittings. Although as Chris said number plates could be completely made up' although police can recognise plates and garages often have number plate recognition cameras.

Neighbouring watches have been contacted to see about a joint meeting with the Police and Community Plan reps as part of the good feedback from the survey re NW and the general feeling is that most people would like the police to be more visible and easier to contact. Other watch leads are:
